Russian police performed **Daft Punk's "Get Lucky"** as part of the **Winter Olympics 2014 Opening Ceremony** in Sochi last Friday (February 7), reports **Rolling Stone** (via **NME**).

The all-male Russian Police Choir performed their rendition of the hit song whilst dressed in their military uniforms, with two soloists singing the majority of the **Grammy Award**-winning track. It's not the first time the choir has sung the song though. In November 2013, a video of them practising the track went viral after it was shared online. Meanwhile, other performers at the Opening Ceremony in Sochi included Russian duo **t.A.T.u**, who released their gold-certified single **"All the Things She Said"** in 2002. Last night, **Yulia Volkova** and **Lena Katina** performed a version of their 2003 single **"Not Gonna Get Us,"** sung in their native language.
