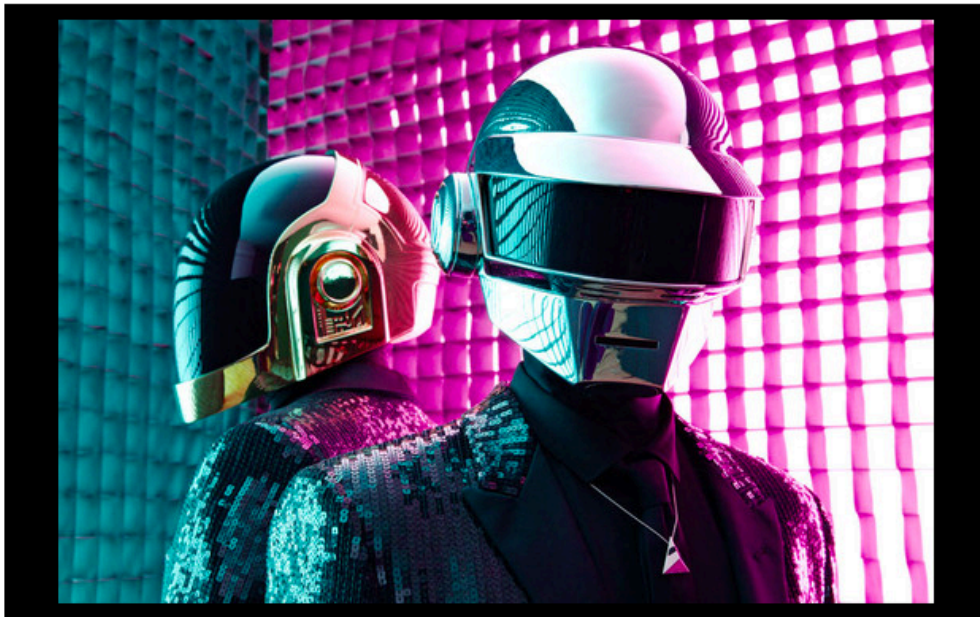

Russian police performed Daft Punk's 'Get Lucky' as part of the Winter Olympics 2014 Opening Ceremony in Sochi last night (February 7), reports [Rolling Stone](#).

The all-male **Russian Police Choir** performed their rendition of the hit song whilst dressed in their military uniforms, with two soloists singing the majority of the Grammy Award-winning track. It's not the first time the choir has sung the song though. In November 2013, a video of them practising the track went viral after it was shared online. Meanwhile, other performers at the Opening Ceremony in Sochi included Russian duo tATu, who released their gold-certified single 'All The Things She Said' in 2002. Last night, Yulia Volkova and Lena Katina performed a version of their 2003 single 'Not Gonna Get Us', sung in their native language.
